Hypoallergenic Pet Myths

Many breeders now claim to have "hypoallergenic pets" (cat, dog, etc). Unfortunately, **there is no such thing as a hypoallergenic pet**.

Allergens from pets such as a cat or dog include not only allergens present on its skin, but also potentially in its saliva. Allergy is not associated necessarily with the "hair" itself; an allergy to animal dander is related to shedding, but more so the skin (similar to dandruff in humans). Sometimes hairless animals can be the worst offenders for allergy since there is direct contact with the allergen secreted from the skin.



Amount of allergen present varies animal to animal, but there is not a consistency in amount of allergen related to breed. Therefore, it is not possible to have a guaranteed hypoallergenic pet.
